**Storyteller Indiana Bones Sharing Adventures at Libraries**

**Rapid City, S.D.** – June 29, 2010 – Come and explore with Indiana Bones as he seeks fortune and glory in the legends of the high seas at the Rapid City Public Libraries on Thursday, July 8. Indiana Bones has traveled the world to gather his stories and with the use of artifacts, fossils, puppets, and the crack of his bull whip will lead the audience on a journey through time.

Played by Emmy Award Winner Mike McCartney, Indiana Bones, along with his pet dragon, Draco the Sea Serpent, will dig up old Greek myths of Poseidon the master of the waves, Medusa the ugly gorgon and other Greek Heroes. They will be at the downtown library located at 610 Quincy St. at 11 a.m. and the north library located at 10 Van Buren St. at 2 p.m.

McCartney is a former PBS documentary producer/writer, TV personality and professional actor. He is now a full time professional storyteller and guest lecturer at the University of New Mexico. He believes storytelling can be used as an effective teaching tool and he combines artifacts, fossils, action, adventure, ancient legends, mythology, and folklore.
